Matthew 28:16-20

Mission is Movement

Genesis 12:1–3 (NIV) — 1 The LORD had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. 2 "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Matthew 28:16–20 (NIV) — 16 Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Mission is Motivated by Faith

Matthew 6:31–33 (NIV) — 31 So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. 33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (See also, Matt. 6:25-34)

❖ As the Church, we are a people who trust completely in God's provision as we are obedient to his purpose for us in Christ.

Central Thought

Part 1: A church or individual focused on the comfortable and familiar will never experience God's blessing or enter into God's purpose.

Part 2: A church or individual focused on God's kingdom purposes – with a willingness to go and to serve as he leads – will be filled with joy, faith and hope.
