The Reality of Resemblance

1 John 2:28-3:10

Series: Reality Check – (re)Aligning Our Lives to the Way of Jesus

Central Passages

1 John 2:29–3:3 (ESV) — 29 If you know that he is righteous, you may be sure that everyone who practices righteousness has been born of him. 1 See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. 2 Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. 3 And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.

Central Thought: The proof that we are God's children is that we look like Jesus.

Context

❖ The appearing of Christ at his second and final coming to judge the living and the dead. (vs. 2.28; 3: 2-3, See also 1 John 1:2)

Acts 10:39–42 (ESV) — 39 And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, 40 but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, 41 not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. 42 And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead.

Leaning into Our Lineage

❖ As faithful followers of Jesus, our primary identity is as children of God! (vs. 3:1-3)

John 1:11–13 (ESV) — 11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. 12 But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, 13 who were born, not of blood noof the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. (See also John 3:3)

Mark 3:32–35 (ESV) — 32 And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." 33 And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" 34 And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 For whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

❖ We know we have become children of God when unrighteousness makes us uncomfortable, and love becomes our primary language. (vs. 4-10)

Ephesians 5:1–5 (NLT) — 1 Imitate God, therefore, in everything you do, because you are his dear children. 2 Live a life filled with love, following the example of Christ. He loved us and offered himself as a sacrifice for us, a pleasing aroma to God. 3 Let there be no sexual immorality, impurity, or greed among you. Such sins have no place among God's people. 4 Obscene stories, foolish talk, and coarse jokes—these are not for you. Instead, let there be thankfulness to God. 5 You can be sure that no immoral, impure, or greedy person will inherit the Kingdom of Christ and of God. For a greedy person is an idolater, worshiping the things of this world.

❖ The more we hang out with Jesus, the more our lives will resemble his. (vs. 28, 6; See also John 15:1-17).

John 15:5–12 (ESV) — 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing... 9 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. 10 If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love...12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.
