#### The Stain of Anger

James 1:19-21

Series: Stained - The Truth About Sin, Salvation and Sanctification

### **Central Passage**

James 1:19–21 (NIV) — 19 My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, 20 because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. 21 Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

**Central Thought:** Un-sanctified, human anger is always destructive.

Sanctification: The process of growing in holiness by the ongoing, gracious work of the Spirit of Jesus within us.

# The Cure to Unrighteous, Destructive Anger

❖ Listen closely – to God and each other.

**Proverbs 18:13 (NLT)** — 13 Spouting off before listening to the facts is both shameful and foolish.

❖ Speak thoughtfully – as one who is accountable to God.

James 2:12–13 (NIV) — 12 Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, 13 because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

❖ Act appropriately – with the goal of justice and reconciliation.

Romans 12:17–19 (NIV) — 17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. 18 If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. 19 Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.

❖ Repent of sin – to avoid self-righteousness.

Matthew 7:1–5 (NIV) — 1 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. 2 For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. 3 "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? 4 How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? 5 You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

❖ Seek God – to know his will

Romans 12:1–2 (NIV) — 1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. 2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.
