The Priority and Power of Love

Series: The Fruit of the Spirit – Living a Life that Pleases God Galatians 5:22-23/I John 4:7-21

The Four Loves:

- Eros sexual and possessive, based on merit and attraction (not used in N.T.)
- Storge the natural affection one feels for family
- Phileo friendly, brotherly love, based on merit and mutual interest
- ✤ Agape God-like love, unmerited and self-sacrificing

Romans 5:8 (NIV) — 8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Central Thought: God created us for and calls us to an uncommon, God-like love that can only be accomplished through the continuing presence of the Spirit of Jesus within us.

Galatians 5:22 (NIV) — 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness...

✤ God is the source of love

1 John 4:7–8 (NIV) — 7 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.

✤ God is the model of love

1 John 4:9–10 (NIV) — 9 This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. 10 This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

✤ We are called to God-like love

1 John 4:11–12 (NIV) — 11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

1 John 4:19–21 (NIV) — 19 We love because he first loved us. 20 Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. 21 And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.

Homework/Questions

- Read/reflect on 1 John 4:7-21.
- Open your heart in faith to God's unmerited love for you in Christ Jesus, and ask him to forgive you and fill you with his Holy Spirit.
